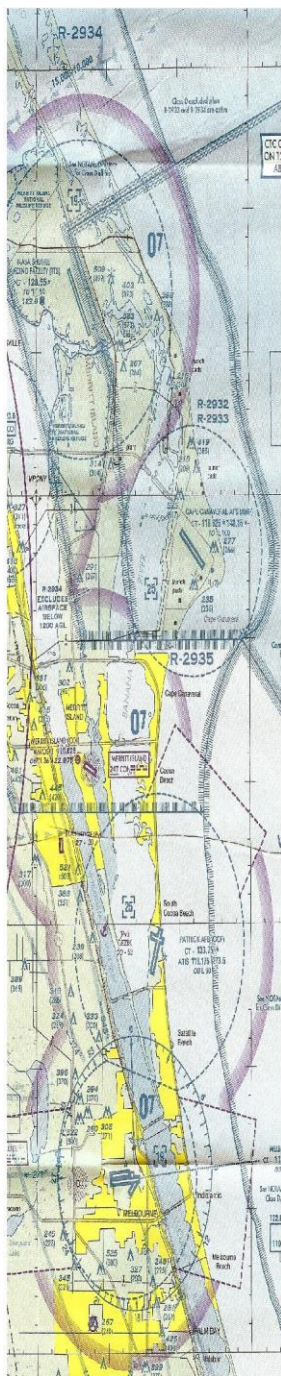

Congratulations to Marcia Gitelman: On November 16, 2016 the Federal Aviation Administration awarded Marcia K Gitelman, of Port Orange, FL (formerly of Rochester, NY), The Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award. This "Master Pilot" Award is the most prestigious award the FAA issues to pilots certified under Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, part 61. It is named after the Wright Brothers to recognize individuals who have exhibited professionalism, skill and aviation expertise for at least 50 years. Now that the award has been issued, her name, city and state will be published to a "Roll of Honor" on the FAA Safety website.

Marcia joined the 99s in November 1968. She was a member of the Western New York Chapter until she became a charter member of the Finger Lakes Chapter in 1973 following the terminus of the Powder Puff Derby in Elmira, NY. In 2014 after relocating to Florida, she transferred to the Spaceport Chapter. She is a Commercial, Instrument rated pilot for Single Engine Land and Sea.
