September 13th: We met at Space Coast Regional Airport, in the meeting room of the TICO Airport Authority. Dr. Niara Petralanda talked to us about Back Country flying and how to prepare for it.

October 10, 11, 2025 - Southeast Section Meeting Daytona, Florida

Forty-one excited people attended the Southeast Section meeting in Daytona Beach, Florida. Spaceport was well represented with seven members in attendance: Carol Gosling, Sharon Crotty, Donna Wilt, Pat Ohlsson, and Judi Oswald. Mimi Hanley drove up from Melbourne and Denise Schmedeman drove in from Sanford to have dinner with us on Friday night at Carrabba's restaurant.

People came from all over the Southeast Section with one Director flying in from Washington state. She flew half way across the country in her own plane until weather prevented her from continuing and she picked up a commercial flight to make the meeting.

The two speakers were excellent – Mr. Foster (a former ATC from Boston Airport, now living in Florida) gave a very informative talk on the FAA's plans for airspace around several major airports. These changes will have a big impact on GA flying.

Dr. Leo Murphy, professor from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, talked about Amelia Earhart. This was an expanded and newly updated talk on the presentation he gave at our Spaceport chapter meeting at Spruce Creek two years ago. Everyone was enthralled with his lively presentation.

The 99 of Note Award was given out to one nominated member from each chapter, who represented a dedication to the field of aviation. Christine Keefe was the Spaceport's 99 of Note.

The new Aviation Manual was unveiled, which is available in the Library section on the International website. There is a lot of great information presented in the manual and much time and effort has gone into this.

The Board did mention that they are hoping to get everyone voting online. It was reiterated to press chapter members to switch to electronic voting as each paper ballot on the international level can cost upwards of \$40. Along with the cost, the return rate of the paper ballot is only just over 50%. It was stated that thousands of dollars are spent on these paper ballots with not much return.

The camaraderie of being around women pilots was infectious and I really enjoyed my first ever "big" 99s meeting and am looking forward to attending more.
